Partners in Faith Formation

The Confirmation Class is finishing up on the Ten Commandments. I think confused them when I told them that the summary of the commandments can be found in this New Testament thought: ***Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself.*** It shows up as one of the 10 when I ask them to list the commandments. Oops. But I still stand by my statement – it is a good summary; I will try to be clearer about my meaning next time.

Loving your neighbor as yourself is the essence of the last 7 commandments. One of the foundations for “loving neighbor” is to have empathy for the other....to be able to identify with and be concerned for other’s feelings and needs. Empathy makes us aware of the suffering of others and allows us to feel that suffering as our own. Adults need to help nurture that in children. Adults can watch for opportunities for conversation on how to treat others. Here are some tips for growing empathy and compassion:

Help children to think about how others feel. If a child says or does something hurtful to another child, help them to focus their attention on the other’s feelings e.g. ask "How do you think they feel? Would you like to feel like that?"

Talk about the point of view of others as you watch TV, read books or discuss other people with your child e.g. ask "What do you think that character or person is feeling and thinking?"

Children develop empathy and compassion by *practicing acts of caring and kindness towards others.* Involve your children in showing care toward others, such as doing errands for sick neighbors or opening doors for others.

Guide your children in being open to differences they see in others (e.g. people of different cultures or backgrounds), in giving others the benefit of the doubt, and in explaining others actions in the kindest ways (that directly relates to the 8th commandment!).

Lenten Book Study 2012

The Last Week: What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus' Final Days in Jerusalem
by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan

Taking the Gospel of Mark as their guide, Borg and Crossan "retell a story everyone thinks they know too well and most do not seem to know at all." They set out to explore the last week in Jesus' life against the backdrop of Roman imperial control. Their purpose is not to attempt a historical reconstruction of what has become known as the "Passion" or suffering of Jesus, but to probe the things Jesus was passionate about. They chose the Gospel of Mark, because it was the earliest to be written, the most succinct, and the one with the most time markers for the week's events.

The passion of Jesus for the kingdom of God was a threat to the domination systems of his time. He also spoke about God's passion for justice. Borg and Crossan conclude, "Good Friday and Easter, death and resurrection together, are a central image in the New Testament for the path to a transformed self. The path involves dying to an old way of being and being reborn into a new way of being. Good Friday and Easter are about this path, the path of dying rising, of being born again."

Books cost \$11. Books have been ordered, so watch the bulletin for when the books become available. As always at Gloria Dei, if the cost would prohibit your participation in the discussion, please talk to Pam L-Z or one of the pastors for a scholarship. For those who own a Kindle or Nook, both Amazon and Barnes and Noble offer this book in their format for about \$10.

IS MY CHILD READY TO RECEIVE COMMUNION?

If you are the parent or caregiver for a young child, you may be wondering when he or she is ready to begin receiving communion. In the past, tradition may have given the impression that this sacrament was a privilege enjoyed by only those who could understand it.

Consider these two statements from *The Use of the Means of Grace**: Admission to the sacrament is *by invitation of the Lord*, presented through the church to those who are baptized.

There is no command from our Lord regarding the age at which people should be baptized or first communed. . . . In all communion practices, congregations strive to avoid both reducing the Lord's Supper to an act effective by its mere performance without faith and narrowing faith to intellectual understanding of Christ's presence and gifts.

Your child's readiness is best determined by parent or caregiver, in consultation with Pastor Karl and Pam L-Z. Each child is different, and each will pick up on the significance of the meal at a different point. One important cue for readiness is your child showing signs of feeling excluded. Other questions for you:

Has your child been baptized?

Is your child comfortable in various locations around the church, including at the altar?

Will your child extend his or her hands when asked to do so?

Is your child aware enough of others in the congregation to show respect for their communion experience?

Are you prepared to help make the process positive?

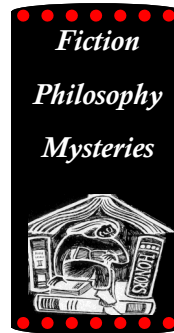
Only the first question requires a yes before your child can be considered ready. But the others help understand your child's sense of belonging in the faith community and can aid you as you guide your child's participation throughout the years.

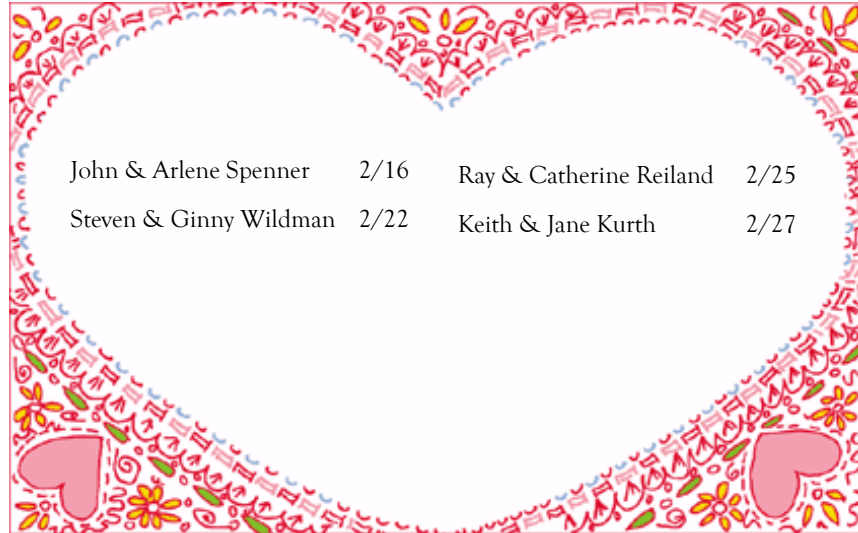
**AND THE OSCAR FOR BEST PICTURE GOES TO....
